2.1 Rationale/ justification

Multi-sectoral interventions that support young children and their families facilitate the entire child development process. Kindergartens KG1 and 2 prepare children for school, reduce dropouts, improve learning outcomes and general developmental outcomes linked to sociability, motor-skills, and emotional language.

In Jordan, the number of children enrolled in nurseries and KGs is low (3 per cent of children are in nurseries; 14.2 per cent in KG1; and 62.2 per cent in KG2). The Government has an ambitious plan to universalize KG2, while increasing the number of children enrolled in and the quality of nurseries and KG1. These plans are linked to the Human Resources Development strategy. Given the strong gender bias in Jordan towards female pre-school
