Prospective and future projects

A) Agreements:

- 1) Activate the agreement that has been signed by the Hashemite University (HU) and University of Texas at Arlington (UTA) by:
- Establishing a simulation lab similar to the smart hospital in UTA to be used for students' training.
- Sending 2-3 faculty members to get their training in the smart hospital/UTA and study NLN modules for 2-3 weeks to be able to do the same training in nursing and medicine labs at HU (upon the agreement with the Nursing dean at UTA).
- In case of training 2-3 faculty members, the FON will be able to apply OSCE and Capstone for nursing students in their courses especially those in the last year of study to ensure providing adequate quality of care.
- 2) Establish a Research group for reproductive health in cooperation with Higher Population Council where an internal committee was founded in the Department of Maternal, Child and Family Health Nursing at HU which will be responsible to follow up the strategic plan of the Higher Population Council and Share Net Foundation/Holland.

B) Educational Plans:


- 1) Updating nursing curriculum to be in accordance with new developments in health and encourage research utilization and conduction.
