The project will benefit the Jordanian universities staff and students at the educational level, and will build the capacity of the doctors who are working in primary health care centers (including academic staffs) in several Governmental, Army/Public defender and Refugees international organizations.

Project in lines

MDP goals will be achieved by international academic collaboration. The group work is evaluated by the universities as higher educational institutions that respect the pedagogical process in Jordan. And will be streamed in the medical sector through the Ministry of Health.

The preparation phase, the first time period of project lifetime, aims at framing the objectives of building the Jordanian doctors capacity; who are the medical practitioners in the Jordanian health centers, that they are expected to benefit the cities/areas with minimum 45 patients per center, as a daily base.

Focusing on the current situation of the primary health care in Jordan; A field research took place between January and April 2021, at the personal experience level: academic and medical staff, student at universities, and at the organizational (logistic) level: health care centers (family medicine clinics) in several Jordanian cities.

The results of the field research came with the several teaching and training needs, at both the university and the clinical levels. The main finding is to provide Jordanian universities with short time degree, a diploma, which includes the needed practical sessions that combine with the teaching/learning outcomes.

The project outcome is a diploma in the Family Medicine (Primary Health Care); it will be issued and prepared by the European expertise, who are in the project consortium. The diploma will be launched officially and will be well announced for the targeted groups through the official and national channels.

In the second phase of the project, the training and diploma implantation will take place; at least two times during the project life time. Several diploma lectures will be implemented by the European expertise. In addition to that, several long term trainings for the academic staff who are in the medical faculties will be held in the European medical centers, as a kind of elaboration for the Jordanian medical experience.

At the end of the project; several reports, materials, feedback will be published in the project official website; which includes the main diploma studying platform.

Project Implementation Phases

his European funded project aims to strengthen the Jordanian health sector through the academic support, and is implemented in Jordan as applicant and partner country.

There are six Jordanian and European partner-members from four countries, are working together to implement the project activities. The project actual lifetime is three years; started from 2021.

Project Preparation

Phase

Work Package One

During this phase of the project, the needs analysis will be performed to find the best curriculum and program to meet these needs.

Work Package Two

The design of the program will be further developed by: The formation of a curriculum development team, recruiting further staff members, Ensuring the understanding of expectations of all staff members, consulting with individuals who have developed curriculum for other similar programs in the region.

Project Development Phase

Work Package Three

During this phase of the project, the training sites will be established.

Work Package Four

Application developed and interview process established, Eligible candidates interviewed and best candidates will be chosen.

Work Package Five

Adequate training of local program staff will be given. Every time the partners meet to discuss the development and establishment of the program, there will also be training involved, but this WP focuses specifically on that topic. Local staff will be trained in evidence-based medicine techniques. Local staff will receive training in coaching and mentoring techniques.

Work Package Six

Program will be established and operating. Program trainers will receive ongoing mentorship and training by EU partner HEIs

Work Package Seven

Supervisory board will be established. Quarterly meetings will be scheduled to evaluate the ongoing larger needs and objectives of the program.

Work Package Eight

Complete formal program evaluation at end of each year.
