Department of Physical and Occupational Therapy (2021 – 2024)

Introduction by the Head of the Department

The Department of Physical and Occupational Therapy at the Hashemite University, which was established in 1999, is considered one of the first departments in Jordan to award a bachelor's degree in the fields of physical therapy and occupational therapy. Each major consists of 136 credit hours, including hours for theoretical subjects, hours for practical laboratories, and hours for field training.

The Department has a distinguished academic staff and includes 14 doctoral and masters holding faculty members from prestigious international universities, and 9 laboratory instructors to deliver practical training. Currently, 450 male and female students are studying in the Department. The Department includes 7 laboratories for the application of the practical modules which are equipped with the necessary equipment and tools. In addition to these laboratories, the Department is linked to the Community Rehabilitation Center of the Hashemite University, which aims to provide rehabilitation services to the local community in the governorates of Zarqa and Mafraq.

The Department of Physical and Occupational Therapy enjoys a close relationship with many medical institutions outside the University for the purpose of training students. These relationships include joint cooperation agreements with the Ministry of Health, the Royal Medical Services, several associations (such as the Hussein Society for the Physically Challenged and the Doctors Without Borders Association), as well as private sector hospitals. In the future, the Department of Physical and Occupational Therapy hopes to establish a master's program in Rehabilitation Sciences in addition to other programs. Note that the Department is currently working on establishing a higher diploma program in cooperation with the Al-Hussein Society for the Physically Challenged in Community Rehabilitation.

Amongst the Department's most important achievements in the past years has been implementing voluntary medical care providing days, inside and outside the University campus, organizing scientific trips for the students of the Department, coordinating visits by specialists in the field of rehabilitation sciences to the University, participating many conferences inside and outside the University, in addition to holding seminars and workshops for students and graduates to develop their clinical and academic skills.

Over the past years, more than 500 physiotherapists and occupational therapists have graduated qualified to work in the local and foreign medical sector. Since its establishment, the Department has continued to attract distinguished faculty members and laboratory supervisors with practical experience and whom continuous update their study plans and content of materials in line with the development of the medical sector and creating agreements and partnerships

with hospitals and health authorities in Jordan, in addition to the effective and continuous integration of students in the teaching process.
