Course Title: Remedial English (121602099)

This course is a none-credit university requirement offered by the Language Centre to students who failed the English language level test. It offered at the low intermediate level to develop the students' abilities in basic skills of English in particular reading and writing. It also helps students to deal with challenging language skills that will be taken in English Communication Skills. The course gives special emphasis to the basic English grammar, structure, and vocabulary that are commonly used in daily communication.

Course Objectives:

- To introduce students with the basic English grammatical rules and structures.
- To provide students with reading skills that allow them to understand a variety of texts and help them answering comprehension questions.
- To develop the students' vocabulary.
- To comprehend different dialogues and conversations.
- To encourage students to express ideas in speech and writing using English.
